**Meeting Initiation**

Chair Snow called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

**Recreation Department**

Ms. Berger reviewed previous year's projects and provided a status update as to the Ames Street basketball courts and bocce court at the Recreation Center.

**Playground Project Phase 2**

Ms. Berger presented the Phase 2 Playground Project to the Committee. She stated they want to fix the cracked cement around the concession stand, add in musical elements as well as a big rock chute for ages 7-12 and security cameras at a cost of \$131,468.

Mr. Hauser asked that a summary sheet of costs be provided for next meeting.

Chair Snow said he needed to determine if security cameras were an allowable spending under the Community Preservation Act.

**Veterans Memorial Park Beach Improvement**

Ms. Berger stated this project included perimeter edging, a check in booth, foot wash station, water fountains, decking in front of the concession stand, picnic tables and umbrellas and camera and fiber for cable access. The estimate for this project is \$91,348.

The CPC requested Ms. Berger to provide more details.

**Other**

Ms. Saunders was introduced to the Committee as its newest member from the Housing Authority replacing Jane Desberg.

The invoice for the coalition dues in the amount of \$1,750.00 was approved.

Mr. Pinkowitz moved to accept the 2/15/17 minutes. They were seconded by Mr. Bluestein and the committee voted 4-0-2 (Saunders and Geller not present) in favor of approval.

Mr. Hauser suggested some CPC funding be used for open space at the new Town Hall to be built.

Chair Snow reviewed the current CPC balance as well as previous projects with the Committee.

**Adjournment**

Mr. Hauser moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:30 PM. Mr. Geller seconded the motion and the Committee voted 6-0-0 in favor.
