Foxboro resident and local herpetologist, Brian Cassie, has been researching wildlife population trends for fifty years. Mr. Cassie dedicated 2023 to herptiles – and joined the Conservation Commission at its December 7th meeting to share his data. Massachusetts is home to about 50 species of reptiles and amphibians. From March to November, over the course of 33 visits, Mr. Cassie observed 22 species along Moose Hill Street. He called it the most species-diverse place he's seen in Massachusetts this year. Mr. Cassie also noted he spotted over 200 victims of roadkill. His data will be put up on the Conservation Department web page.

Lake levels are steady at 9.72, up from earlier in the season. Philibert removed one board from the control structure in the lagoon with long term planning in mind.

Philibert hopes to contact Zoo New England to discuss habitat improvements at the bogs. He has been dismantling dams that a beaver has been making in the Middle Pond.
