- i. Advisement regarding a Town of Sharon DEI Director

Toben Asklar presented the DEIC unanimous recommendation for a full-time DEIC professional for the town. The Select Board will discuss this recommendation further on August 22, and (possibly) vote on the recommendation.

ii. Recommendations of DEI training module(s) for town boards and committees.

Bill Kondrath led the discussion at the Select Board meeting (August 1). The DEIC recommended

SunShower Learning as a vendor for training. He presented the DEIC recommendation of a course on

Defeating Unconscious Bias. Kiana Pierre-Louis suggested that we add a course on Disarming Microaggressions. The recommendation is that we start the contract October 1, 2023. The town would have one year to access the training course(s). A discussion took place on who would be required to attend. The Select Board will further discuss and vote on these matters on August 22. Toben Asklar recommended that DEIC be among the first people to take this training. Shelley Keimach recommended that each board or committee discuss what they learned.
