




What does the Veterans Services Department do?

- The Veterans Services Department provides assistance, guidance and advocacy for Sharon veterans and their families.
- Veterans are eligible for medical care, disability, tax relief programs, burial allowances, grave markers, home loans, pensions, correction of military records and other benefits.



The Veterans Services Department aids and assist all veterans, their widows or spouses, and/or their dependent children, in the Town of Sharon through the Massachusetts Department of Veterans Services, medical assistance, financial aid, assistance with state applications for veterans' benefits and administration of veteran's benefits provided by the U.S. Department of Veterans' Affairs.



How many veterans live in Sharon?


- There are an estimated 1,500 veterans in the Town of Sharon, according to the Veterans Services Department.
- Sharon's veterans include those who served in World War II as well as those in more recent conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan.


